

AWARENESS ON POSTPARTUM DEPRESSION



The postpartum depression (PPD) awareness event opened the attendees' eyes to how prevalent it is in the society, and its dangerously high prevalence. The starring speaker of the event was Ms. Gracy Fernandez, a respected practitioner in the field of psychology. She shared her deep expertise on postpartum depression, clarifying its complex nature to extend the audience's awareness and understanding of the topic.

20 OCT TBILISI. GEORGIA Ms. Gracy broadened the audience's thinking regarding the disorder's features, severity, and complexity, and also went over what strategies can help cope or even prevent PPD. Further, she enlightened everyone on what actions can be taken to support and assist someone going through PPD, making it a very valuable opportunity for all attendees to stop and reflect on what they can do to help these new mothers.

Finally, a case study about the topic was also presented by Ms. Gracy which helped the audience to truly think about and gain an understanding of the mood disorder, and the distress and emotional impact that PPD unfolds.

It was a true pleasure to have Ms. Gracy on the webinar to educate medical students on the topic of postpartum depression and the knowledge will surely continue to benefit all attendees in the future of their medical careers.

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RAPID RESPONSE EMERGENCY DESMURGY AND BLEEDING WORKSHOP



The Rapid Response Emergency Desmurgy and Bleeding Workshop was organized at TSMU's Blue Hall. The event brought in 30 participants to take part in a dynamic session, with the help of the academic team and events team of the University.

The event featured hands-on training in bandage desmurgy, with specific techniques led by pairs of skilled members. Crossshaped nape wrapping, humeral joint bandages, glove bandages, ankle fracture wrapping, and the Hippocrates cap technique were all of importance while teaching. 28 OCT TBILISI.

Her specialties include Reproductive Medicine, Gynaecological Endocrinology, and Gynaecology.

The talk comprised of insightful discussions on PCOD prophylaxis, and open discussions to breaking the silence and unravelling the stigmatized notion about PCOD.





Various doubts posed by the attendees were cleared leading to a better connect with the community to understand these struggles deeply.


All participants also got the chance to take home NutriVibe, is a free and healthful PCOD friendly regime full of diet and nutrition tips.

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NOVENBER osce workshop: peer-assisted learning



Additionally, they gained valuable insights into exam strategies, allowing them to approach future examinations with more confidence and preparedness.




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KAIZEN: MENTAL HEALTH WORKSHOP

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CV WORKSHOP


